Did you Know?

- One person is currently under sentence of death in NH.
- NH's last execution was in 1939.
- In 2000, a bill to abolish the death penalty passed both houses of the legislature, but was vetoed by Governor Shaheen.
- 138 innocent people have been released from death row in the US since 1973.
- Most of the world has abolished the death penalty. The US, China, Iran, North Korea and Yemen execute the most people.
- Capital cases cost more than life in prison without parole.
- Most of the murder victim family members who have testified in NH oppose the death penalty.
